

The annual Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Ministry is the perfect opportunity for us to show children in other countries just how much they mean to us.

Ninette and I have already ordered a wide variety of materials informing people about the ministry and you will soon be able to pick it up on the back counter in the Sanctuary.

Last year, we purchased actual plastic red and green shoeboxes with the Samaritan's Purse shoebox logo. They were much nicer than the cheap plastic ones we had previously used. We plan on purchasing these shoeboxes again at a cost of a little over \$2.00 each. In addition, shipping to each child overseas will be an additional \$10.00 each. The cost to buy and ship our shoeboxes will be close to \$1,500. This amount does not include items bought for the shoeboxes. If you would like to make a donation, please make it to the church and mark it "shoebox".

The ministry still needs a wide variety of items to include if we are to match the 116 boxes we donated last year. A list of the items we need is listed below. Please keep this ministry in your prayers and be on the lookout for additional information in next month's newsletter. A GriefShare support group is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. Through this 13-week group, you'll discover what to expect in the days ahead and what's "normal" in grief. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, you'll learn helpful ways of coping with grief, in all its unpredictability—and gain solid support each step of the way.

VIDEOS THAT ENCOURAGE

Each weekly GriefShare group begins with a 30-minute video featuring respected experts on grief-related topics and helpful stories from people who have experienced loss. Their insights will help you manage your emotions, gain clarity, and find answers to your questions as you walk through the grief process.

SUPPORTIVE DISCUSSIONS

After the video, you and the other group members will spend time discussing what was presented in the video and what is going on in your lives. Talking with other people who understand what you're experiencing brings great comfort, normalizes the grief experience, and offers a supportive environment to work through your grief.

The next session of GriefShare at First United Methodist will begin on Tuesday, September 10 at 6:30 pm in the Trinity Room of the Life Enrichment Bldg. The workbook is only \$20 but scholarships are available.



First Methodist Church of Clewiston Finance Report— August, 2024

July financials reflect the activities of our church's giving, expenditures, and reimbursements for the month.

General giving totaled \$10,734.64 for the month with an additional \$7,044.00 received in special funds. This brings our regular giving to 51.26% of our goal for the year. Total disbursements were \$12,551.98 for the month, bringing our total expenditures to 50% of budgeted annual expenses seven months through the year.

Our church has experienced a significant \$33,242.00 maintenance expense at the parsonage as the roof at the parsonage and main air conditioner were replaced. Kind donations totaling \$5,400.00 have been received to date to help offset this expense. Any special fund giving you feel led to provide for these projects is greatly appreciated.

Your continued support of our church through your presence and gifts is greatly appreciated.

The checking account has been reconciled for the month.



SERVANT OPENINGS AT FIRST METHODIST CHURCH

These teams/positions work together in prayerful harmony to see the mission of our church actively lived out to glorify Christ.

FINANCE TEAM CHAIR

The Finance Team shall oversee the stewardship of financial resources as their priority throughout the year, seeking as part of the ministry of discipleship to move members toward tithing and beyond, with an attitude of generosity.

The Finance Team shall be charged with responsibility for developing and implementing plans that will raise sufficient income to meet the budget adopted by the church council.*

PASTOR PARISH RELATIONS TEAM CHAIR

The PPRC shall engage in biblical and theological reflection on the mission of the church, the primary task and ministries of the local church, and on the role and work of the pastor(s) and staff as they carry out their leadership responsibilities.*

ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL CHAIR

The church council (Ad Council), or its equivalent governing body, shall provide for planning and implementing a ministry of evangelizing and spreading scriptural holiness through nurture, outreach, witness, and resources in the local church. It shall also provide for the administration of its organization and temporal life. It shall envision, plan, implement, and annually evaluate the mission and ministry of the church. The church council shall be amenable to and function as the administrative agency of the charge conference.*

MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY

Each local church shall accurately maintain a permanent membership record for each baptized or professing member.* A membership secretary will oversee these processes or a team that performs these processes.

LAY LEADER

The lay leader is responsible for communications with the laity of the church and to serve as a liaison between the clergy and the members of the congregation. The lay leader is a major figure in the identification of potential leaders within the congregation and in the development and training of those future leaders.* The Lay Leader also works closely with the pastor.

Youth Ministry Leader

The Youth that attend First Methodist Church of Clewiston should be raised up and discipled to become active followers of Jesus Christ. This servant leader will work with the PPR and Ad Council to establish and maintain a Christian spiritual formation program for our youth.
