

SEEING IS BELIEVING

The B&B Believers Bible study group met once again to kick off 2025 on Monday, January 13 at Chris and John Wellslager's house. The tremendous New Year's gathering of 18 Believers enjoyed an evening of Christian fellowship, food and a heart felt message brought to us by Nancy Hatton of God using her as a vessel of salvation for an unlikely recipient of Jesus' forgiveness of sins and assurance of eternal life for those who truly believe He is our risen Savior.

Nancy's message shared a story of God through a spiritual vision of Jesus inviting a Jewish family member home and to salvation and belief in his risen Savior. Much like Thomas' doubting mindset in the Gospel of **John 24:20-29**, at times, our eyes and human nature to want to see physical proof of just about all things in our lives prior to submitting to ourselves that what we're seeing is actually happening or true can sometimes unfortunately hamper our faith eyes. In most cases, our Christian walk is entered into with some semblance of God given physical vision, and the world we experience all of our lives is beautifully taken in through those perfectly created windows.

I recall some of my first memories of attending a church, probably at the age of 8 or 10, at the Salem Methodist Church in Maryland where my brother Steve and I entered the Sunday School class-room alongside quite a few other kids from the area. Messages and activities, much like Mary brings to the children of our congregation each Sunday, were shared and experienced by the dozen or so kids before the leader would ask us to pray. "Close your eyes and bow your heads", was introduced right from the beginning by that Sunday School leader, a request which has been echoed in my mind throughout the over half a century since this wide blue eyed little boy heard those words for the very first time. Pulling the blinds down over our God given windows when we pray to our God shuts out the potential distractions, interruptions and problems our world may introduce as we seek our mind and hearts connection with our Lord.

In order to remain focused with 20/20 faith vision, we're tasked to limit our preconceived thoughts and conclusions we may hastily deduce via the input of our physical eyes, taking the time to close our eyes as we were taught as kids and invite the Holy Spirit to help us see how Jesus sees what we've just physically witnessed. Faith is invisible, so as a visual society grasping the concept of believing in something we can't see can be challenging, **Hebrews 11:1**, especially during times of struggle or adversity in our lives, but when we accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior our faith eyes are instantly opened.

2 Corinthians 5:7 tells us, "We live by faith, not by sight." And as the connection of that absolute truth enters our hearts to live forever, the true vision of our belief becomes crystal clear. The next time you put in a new set of contacts, grab your glasses or reach for those cheaters, take a moment and be sure your faith vision is allowing you to see the world and believe through eyes of faith.

General giving totaled \$ 42,124.25 the month with an additional \$17,163.00 received in special funds. This brings our regular giving to 89.9% of our goal for the year. Total disbursements were \$ 26,034.75 for the month, bringing our total expenditures to 82% of budgeted annual expenses for the entire year.

The generosity of the members of the congregation has brought our budget into a small surplus for the year. Many thanks to each of you for your strong support of our church's mission.
